ADMISSIONS POLICY 2010/2011

General Information

Bisley is a Voluntary Aided Church of England Primary School catering for children between the ages of 4 and 11 years of age. The Admissions authority for the school is the Governing Body.

Number to be Admitted

The Published Admission Number (PAN) for the school, as agreed with the Local Authority, is 45 pupils at entry level each academic year. Children will be admitted at the beginning of the academic year in which they reach their fifth birthday.

Admissions Criteria

The Governors operate an Equal Preference System. If the number of applications for a place at the school is greater than the Published Admission Number (PAN), the school is oversubscribed. This means that the number of admissions has to be limited so the school then uses the following priorities in order when offering places.

1. Looked After Children in the care of the Local Authority.
2. Brothers and sisters (siblings). A sibling is a child who will have another brother or sister (or half brother/half sister living at the same address, or foster child living at the same address) still at the school. A younger sibling will be given priority admission only if the other sibling will still be at the school in on the date of admission.
3. Children living in the parish of Bisley and West End .
A map indicating the boundary is available on request from the Clerk to Governors.

In the event of over subscription in any of the above priorities, the distance from the school (with distance being measured by a straight line from the front door of house to either school gate will be used to admit a pupil.

Notwithstanding the admissions criteria set out above, the Governors must admit a child with special educational needs, with a statement that names the school.

Appeals

If any application is turned down the parents/guardians have the right to appeal. Details are available upon request from the Clerk to the Governors.
